Economic Diversification in Malaysia



- Early strategy
 - targeted production value chain of few primary commodities
- From the 1980s
 - pursue development for a wider range of industries
 - 3 strategies: horizontal, vertical, locational

Benefits of diversification in manufacturing



- Deepen forward/backward linkages
- Increase productivity
- Enable participation in global supply chain
- Moderate influence of commodity price volatility




Two takeaways:

- Practice of normal agglomeration will ensure manufacturing competitiveness




Annual real GDP growth, 1988-2013


Productivity trends in Emerging Asia, 1990-2011 (Index, 2000=100)
